

Dave Brambly will be sending out 540 postcards requesting that members who would like to run for the board submit a resume. The amount to print and mail will be \$189.

Steam Camp –

Bill Kohler reported that there are four persons currently signed up to participate.

Barry Simcoe suggested that a raffle be held for one of the spots at the rail camp. He recommended that tickets be sold at \$10 each, 6 for \$50 and 12 for \$100. The raffle tickets will be sold through July 4. The winning ticket will be drawn at the end of the day on July 4 or July 5. The winner does not need to be present to win.

A motion was made to conduct the raffle by Rebecca Bevans, seconded by Rick Kohler. Motion passed.

Loren Jahn reported that he would like to apply lettering to car 8 during the Arts and Culture steamup on June 16 and 17. Pending approval by museum staff it was decided to budget up to \$100 for paint. Motion made by Howie Foster, Seconded by Rick Kohler. Motion carried.

Loren reported that the roof on car 8 needs to be completed. Ron Allen reported that with the mild temperatures the job can be completed and he will contact the roofer.

Loren would like to paint a mural to be installed in the interpretive center representing the Carson City Virginia & Truckee yard. He has the support of museum staff and is in the process of procuring funding for the project.

-Steam Train Operations-

Kevin Owens requested that the Friends purchase new flags to be displayed on the locomotives during events. The flags will be period appropriate for the age of the equipment. A motion was made by Larry Knack, seconded by Howie Foster to approve \$150.46 for the purchase of the flags. This amount will be deducted from the next quarterly payment to the museum. Motion passed.

Adam Michalski reported that the next issue is being completed. Included in the issue will be the Cal Fire lumber donation, Easter weekend summary, the move of locomotives 18 and 27, Washoe County Sheriff event at the museum and the transfer of the narrow gauge car the Nevada City.

Adam requested \$390 from the Friends for printing expenses, the amount to be deducted from the next monthly Friends donation to the museum. A motion was made by Rick Kohler, seconded by Rebecca Bevans. Motion passed.

Upcoming Events for 2018

- May:
 - Armed Forces Day May 19 Was a success. We did not have a large showing, but it was a very nice day. It was great having the Carson City Fire Department out there (Thanks to Bob) and also the Sheriff's Department. They would be a great addition to any event and the Friends would like to extend an invitation to them for all events. I do believe the CCFD is interested in attending events.
 - We did not have a food truck, but we did have the kettle corn vendor and people were happy with them.
- June:
 - Arts and Culture Day (formally the Steampunk Event) June 16
 - Steampunk, Burners, and Cosplay members are welcome
 - Costumes encouraged, we want this to be a fun and free atmosphere.
 - Wristbands will be available for purchase.
 - There will be 7 craft vendors in the depot. Those vendor spots filled up quickly and more would have attended if we had more room.
 - King of Kings will be onsite selling food, as will the Kettle Corn vendor.
 - High Desert Steam will be taking professional photos in front of the Dayton outside the annex. A part of the proceeds will go to the FNSRM. They are charging \$20 per digital photo. I am not sure how much they will give to the Friends. Any amount is great, and they will be bringing many of their followers so this helps increase attendance at the event.
 - Volunteers needed in the depot to help set up tables for vendors, to man the Friends table in the depot, and to assist guests in finding their way around the event.
 - Father's Day Steam Up June 17
 - We are hoping to have a food truck on site. No answer as of yet.
 - Saturday's crafters will have the option to stay through Sunday
- July:

 - Craft vendors in the depot a possibility. I have not heard back from vendors yet.
